A message from Father Mark

On Sunday, we heard the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Most everybody - Christian or not - has listened to this story. It is my favorite parable. And it has a lot to teach us.

The parable is ostensibly about a "son," but it's really about a father. Through it, we learn that God's love for us is so all-encompassing that God always joyfully embraces us, no matter how terrible we or others perceive our "sins" to be.

We know the story. The son goes off and squanders his inheritance and winds up destitute. He returns to his family's land, hoping to be hired as a laborer. He knows what he has done is wrong. He doesn't receive the reception he's expecting. When his father sees his son far off, he is "filled with compassion." His "heart goes out" to his son. This is not the act of someone angry with his son. This is not someone — as we talked about last week — who is keeping score. The father is overcome with love for his child. And note, too, that the father runs. He runs to his son. He doesn't meet him halfway up the driveway to the house. His father could not wait to restore these things to him, to lavish him, the lost son, with his love and to bring him back into his family once again.

This is how God loves us, friends. Whatever the situation, whatever the mess, whatever mistakes we've made. God sees us from afar; God runs to us and comes down from heaven as a human for us so that we might be restored to

unity with him. God is always there to embrace us with open arms, to hug us close to himself, and say, "My child who once was dead is alive again. My child who was lost is now found." That's how much he loves us.

Question of the Week: Has there ever been a time when you felt that something you had done or not done placed you outside of a relationship with God? Have you looked for unconditional love where it couldn't be found? How does the Parable of the Prodigal Son put those concerns into perspective?
