

<u>The Second Sunday of Easter</u> is familiar to us by the name Low Sunday, but it is also has other names, including Divine Mercy Sunday, the Octave Day of Easter, White Sunday, Quasimodo Sunday, Bright Sunday, Antipascha, New Sunday, and Thomas Sunday.

A message from Father Mark

Thomas had doubts. So what? Doubt is not the same as non-belief. Thomas is not a figure to be pitied or disliked for asking questions. On the contrary, I believe that Thomas is critical to understanding this passage of Scripture because he embodies a specific kind of person: Thomas is that person who asks for evidence. And, contrary to a lot of prevailing wisdom about Thomas, I think Thomas asks for evidence not because he doesn't believe, but because he desperately wants to believe.

One of the reasons that the church exists is to make Jesus more real to people. It's fashionable to talk about the decline of the Church in this country. And if you look at church membership, across Christian denominations, fewer people indeed attend weekly services now than did 30 years ago. But don't be fooled. That is not because people don't want to believe. People desperately want to believe. They want to be grounded in something larger than themselves, they want to be inspired. The state of the world can largely be

explained by people casting about wildly for something to believe in. But they want to believe in something real. Friends, Jesus is real. Lots of those people just need to see Jesus.

And that's where you and I come in. We show them Jesus every time we reveal our own wounds and the ways that God has lovingly led us through hard times. We show them Jesus when we do the things that Jesus asked us to do: feed the hungry, give water to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, tend the sick, clothe the naked, and visit those in prison. And we show them Jesus when we love them, listen to them when they need to talk or cry, welcome them into our lives, or just show them some basic kindness.

Question of the Week: In what ways can you help Jesus feel more real to the people around you?
